PRESIDENTS MESSAGE September 2016

What happens to your membership fees? Your annual dues are \$50.00 (or \$45.00 Early Bird Rate) a portion of which goes to Provincial and Dominion Command's.

Poppy Report



On the 28th of October, 2016 we will commence our Poppy Campaign. There is a requirement for lots of volunteers to assist in this annual fundraiser.

When you were initiated as a member of The Royal Canadian Legion you declared "to promote the work of the organization including active participation in the Poppy campaign."

Money raised during the campaign is used to improve life for people in the community including assistance to needy ex-service members and their families, purchasing medical equipment and appliances for community health facilities, paying for medical research and training, building and operating affordable housing for veterans and senior citizens, paying for bursaries for needy students, and providing support services to senior citizens (meals-on-wheels, drop-in centres. etc...)

Personnel are required to deliver poppies to businesses in the local area, replenish poppies and remove cash, tag at local area businesses including the Airport. Coordinators are also needed. Lists will be posted in Mid-October for volunteers to put their names on. Anyone willing to volunteer as a coordinator or distribution person can give their name to the chairman of the Poppy Trust Fund.


Summer is coming to an end and our bands will be starting up again and playing both Friday and Saturday nights starting September 2nd.
