

The Annual Ed Neumann Memorial golf tournament was held on Wednesday the 19 of August with many Neumann family members attending. System 36 was used to level the playing field and once all the scores were tabulated our President Cde M. Thayer was declared the winner. Our Annual Championship tournament took place on Sept. 2 at the Players course. Legion Golf Away, summary for 2020.

Good day all,

- 1. Regrettably our Mondays/Tuesdays Legion Golf Away Tour golf season has come to an end. Weather permitting, we may be able to get a few more rounds of golf locally in October.
- 2. This year we golfed at 11 different locations, (12 with St. Boniface but since it was restricted to foursomes, I did not include it in the summary), rescheduled Grand Pines (unable to give us 4

consecutive times) to Netley Creek. Although Rainman Wayne, predicted 2 cancellations, we did not have one cancellation for inclement WX. Most of us found it extremely difficult playing with very in high winds, which was experienced at Miami and Teulon (see para 3 c).

- 3. This and That.
- a. All courses were in good to great conditions, even John Blumberg who had terrible greens two years ago had 16 of 18 in good conditions. The other 2 greens were recovering quite well.
- b. Rainman Wayne, 0 for 2 Rain Forecast. Leave Weather forecast to the experts. Bernie Roy has been 99% accurate with WX forecasts.
- c. Some have experienced the difficulty of golfing in very high winds, not only does it affect the distance of your Drives and Approach shots but your putts as well (too short, too long or WAY too much break all due to wind directions).
- d. Four Putts. There were at least 2 four putts, Bernie Roy and Claude Parent.
- e. Want to reduce the number of putts, ensure Dave Karpenic is in your group. I played with Dave once at Players, he was very generous with the length of gimmies. One of his regulars in his foursome told me that sometimes Dave's gimmie length is when your golf ball is on the green. LOL
- f. 99% of us, are Seniors, the 1 % applies to Colin Stewart, when checking in, ensure you tell the Pro Shop that you ARE a Senior. If you don't tell them they will charge you as an adult. Just ask Terry. It's really not difficult, all you need to remember is 2 or 3 words: Senior Walking or Senior with Cart. LOL


Special Events


